Robust entrepreneurial incentives, especially dependable and defensible patents, allowed American start-ups a global competitive advantage in the 20th century. However, our present experience — as entrepreneurs, leaders of mid-sized companies, and investors — is that the success that built many of today's great American companies now eludes new entrants and potentially high-growth companies.

Current and proposed patent policies make US patents less valuable by substantially raising costs and elongating risk. It is prohibitively expensive/time-consuming to enforce property rights against infringers, to obtain meaningful remedies, and to defend against the high threat of invalidity before US District Courts and the US Patent and Trademark Office. Enforceable, validly issued patents are fundamental to attracting long-term investment and achieving successful commercialization. Congress, in considering H.R. 9 and S. 1137, must not cripple independent efforts to bring new products to market, to establish pioneering companies, to develop new expertise, and to augment job creation.
